

Registration information for the SSLP course

It is best to sign up for all your other courses first in case the SSLP course puts you in an overload of credit hours.

For those of you who are taking the SSLP course for the first time, sign up for THEO 33936 (CRN 12373), Summer Service Learning: Confronting Social Issues.

If you are doing a second SSLP, sign up for CSC 33936 (CRN13174).

If you are doing the Directed Readings option, ask the professor with whom you are working how to sign up for a Directed Readings course in the department that you are taking the course. This course **replaces** the standard SSLP course, THEO 33936.

Overload of credit hours: If the SSLP puts you in an overload of credit hours, you will need to get permission from your dean to register for the course and that permission is not given until the fall semester. For students in the College of Arts and Letters, we will submit your names to the Dean's Office in August and they will enter you into the course. For students in other colleges, you will need to go to your Dean's office within the first week of the fall semester to get permission and then register for the course. We will remind you of all of this in the fall. Again, this is just if the SSLP course puts you in the situation of an overload of credit hours.

Discipleship Course: THEO 20625 (CRN14769) If you are interested in taking the additional three-credit course in the fall semester, Discipleship: Loving Action for Justice, this course does count as a second required Theology course. It is only open to students who have completed a summer service immersion and is a great opportunity to study in more depth the issues that arise over the summer. The prerequisite for this course is the Foundations course, the first required theology course – there are no exceptions. Study Abroad Students: You need to sign up for the course in the semester that you return to campus. We will offer the follow up groups in the spring semester for those going abroad in the fall semester. Those going abroad for a year will join the 2010 students when you return.
