

Tebaldo Vinciguerra

Tebaldo Vinciguerra has served the Holy See since 2011. He works on environmental issues—chiefly mining, energy, agriculture, water and oceans—in the light of the social teaching of the Catholic Church.

Vinciguerra worked initially as an official of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace and, successively, of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, created by Pope Francis. He currently participates in working groups and conferences at national, regional, and international levels focused on the aforementioned issues, including major UN environmental summits and regional or thematic working groups within the Catholic Church.

Before joining the Holy See, Vinciguerra worked as a researcher on natural disasters at the Center for Strategic Studies of the Italian Ministry of Defense (2008-2009), and as the coordinator of numerous development projects (including building sites and a water-treatment initiative) promoted by the Archdiocese of Lima, Peru (2008-2010).

Tebaldo completed a 5 years University program (2002-2007) in Political Science and International Studies in France (Political Science Institute of Bordeaux) and Italy (Faculty of Political Science of Turin).

In 2016, he participated in the International Visitor Leadership Program, an initiative of the State Department.

In 2017, he co-founded the Italian NGO *Puri di Cuore* which promotes awareness about and recovery from the dangers caused by pornography.

He has been active in Boy Scout groups for 17 years. He is married to Diane and they have three children.
